



SNAP SYLLABUS 2025

SNAP syllabus 2025 has been prepared after understanding the exam pattern and type of questions that have appeared in previous years papers. Overview for syllabus for each section is given below.

1. General English

- Grammar topics like Parts of Speech, Error Spotting, and Correct Usage
- Vocabulary-based questions including Idioms, Proverbs, Synonyms/Antonyms
- Figures of Speech and Fill in the Blanks (Grammar & Vocabulary)

2. Quantitative, Data Interpretation & Data Sufficiency

- Arithmetic and Modern Math (e.g., Percentages, Time-Speed, Probability, Logs)
- Geometry, Numbers, and Algebra (Basic to Moderate Level)
- Data Interpretation via Tables, Graphs, and Caselets (No DS in 2023)

3. Analytical & Logical Reasoning

- Verbal Reasoning: Syllogisms, Assumptions, Cause-Effect, Inference
- Non-Verbal Reasoning: Series, Arrangements, Clocks, Calendars, Family Tree
- Logical Puzzles, Coding-Decoding, Binary Logic, and Odd One Out

SNAP Syllabus 2025 for General English Section

SNAP Exam English Section is officially called “General English, Reading Comprehension and Verbal Ability” section. However, no questions related to Reading Comprehension has appeared in the SNAP 2024 or SNAP 2023 exams! Also note that out of total 60 questions in SNAP 2024 exam, there were only 15 questions in this section. Check type of questions in this section in previous SNAP exam paper pattern.

Considering the type of questions that have appeared in last few years in this section, SNAP syllabus for English section is as follows:

I. Grammar and Sentence Structure

1. Parts of Speech: Nouns, Pronouns, Verbs, Adjectives, Adverbs, Prepositions, Conjunctions, Interjections
2. Spot the Error: Subject-Verb Agreement, Tense Consistency, Article Usage, Prepositions, Sentence Fragments and Run-ons
3. Fill in the Blanks (Grammar-focused): Single and Double Blanks, Verb Tenses, Prepositions, Conjunctions, Modifiers and Word Order
4. Correct Usage: Adjectives vs. Adverbs, Compound Words, Word Order in Sentences, Parallelism, Conjunctions and Sentence Connectors

II. Vocabulary and Idiomatic Usage

1. Vocabulary-based Fill in the Blanks: Contextual Vocabulary, Idiomatic Phrases and Phrasal Verbs, Confused Words (e.g., affect/effect, accept/except)
2. Match the Following: Synonyms, Antonyms, Word-Pair Relationships
3. Proverbs and Their Meanings: Common English Proverbs, Interpretation in Context, Application in Sentences

III. Literary Devices and Figures of Speech

1. Figures of Speech: Simile, Metaphor, Personification, Hyperbole, Irony, Alliteration

Key Takeaways

- Arithmetic and Modern Math have the highest weightage
- Data Interpretation appeared in 2023 with 2 questions
- Data Sufficiency did not appear in 2023, but it's part of the section title and can be tested
- Difficulty level: Mostly easy to moderate, speed and accuracy focused

2. Linear and Circular Arrangements
3. Binary Logic (True/False based puzzles)
4. Family Tree and Blood Relations
5. Clocks – Time-based logical problems
6. Calendars – Day, Date, and Year-related logic
7. Coding-Decoding – Symbol and Letter-based codes
8. Odd One Out
9. Sequential Output – Machine input-output based pattern questions
10. Numerical and Logical Puzzles

Key Takeaways

- Equal mix of Verbal and Non-Verbal reasoning. So both are important.
- Focus on pattern recognition, logic application, and assumption-based analysis
- Mostly easy to moderate difficulty, with emphasis on speed and clarity of thought
