



## MAT Exam Pattern 2026: Sections, Duration, Marking Scheme, Question Types

**MAT 2026 Exam Pattern:** MAT exam pattern is divided into five sections, each containing 30 multiple choice questions. The five sections in MAT exam are: Language Comprehension, Intelligence and Critical Reasoning, Data Analysis and Data Sufficiency, Mathematical Skills and Economic & Business Environment. Also check MAT Mock Tests 2026 and MAT Previous Year Question Paper 2026 to improve your exam preparation. MAT exam 2026 will be held on March 1 and 8, 2026, and MAT Registration 2026 is open.

### MAT Exam Highlights 2026

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MAT is national level MBA entrance exam that is conducted four times in a year by AIMA. MAT 2026 exam will be held in March 2026 in two modes. MAT 2026 Paper Based Test (PBT) will be held on March 1 and MAT 2026 Computer Based Test (CBT) will be held on March 8, 2026. MAT registration 2026 for the both tests has started. ### **MAT Exam Pattern 2026: Overview**

- There are 5 sections with equal number of questions in MAT exam pattern.
- Each section in MAT question paper has 30 questions. Total questions are 150.
- AIMA awards 4 marks for each correct answer (scaled score). Hence, MAT Exam Total Marks are 600.
- All questions are in MCQ format.
- Total exam time duration to solve the MAT question paper is 120 minutes.
- Although, individual time limit for each section has been suggested by AIMA, there is no restriction to move from one section to other freely within overall time limit in the MAT exam pattern

Section wise MAT pattern all the five sections is as below:

#### **Section-1: MAT Exam Pattern for Language Comprehension**

The section-1 in MAT exam paper on Language Comprehension is divided into two parts - Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension.

- RC Passages on Current Affairs and Political Developments
- RC Passages on Business & Economic
- RC passages from various English Literature Books
- RC Passages on Science
- RC Passages in Abstract Topics and Fiction
- RC Passages on Historical Events and Mythology
- Jumbled Paragraphs
- Error Correction of Verb, Noun, Pronoun, Adjective, Adverb and other parts of speech in the Sentences
- Correcting the sequence of sentences in the paragraph for example correct use of conditional sentence, time clauses, reported speech, passive writing
- Antonyms/Synonyms
- Fill in the blanks
- Idioms/Phrases

## **Section 2: MAT Exam Pattern for Intelligence and Critical Reasoning**

The Section-2 on Intelligence & Critical Reasoning consists of two parts with Analytical and Logical Reasoning questions.

### **Section 3: MAT Exam Pattern for Data Analysis and Data Sufficiency**

The section-3 in MAT pattern consists of Data Analysis & Data sufficiency which also has two types of questions – the first type is on Data Analysis which is closer to Data Interpretation and other type of questions are on Data sufficiency.

#### **Data Analysis and Data Sufficiency**

This section is divided into two parts – Data Analysis and Data Sufficiency. Questions are asked from:

- Line Graph
- Pie Chart
- Bar Graph
- Data Comparison
- Caselet
- Quantitative Comparison and Data Sufficiency

### **Section 4: MAT Exam Pattern for Mathematical Skills**

The Section-4 in MAT exam is the Mathematical Skills section. This section is basically the Quantitative Ability section. It is very wide and covers each and every topic in Mathematics with greater emphasis on Arithmetic.

#### **Mathematical Skills**

This Mathematical Skills of MAT is Quantitative Aptitude section. In this section, questions are asked

- Arithmetic
- Trigonometry
- Algebra
- Mensuration Modern Maths
- Geometry

## **Section 5: MAT Exam Pattern for Economic & Business Environment**

This section includes questions from both Current Affairs and Static GK. Although this section carries 30 marks, it is not taken into consideration to determine candidate's MAT score and percentile. So, this section is given low priority by students. The questions are asked from the below topics

- Current Affairs
- Constitution of India
- Business & Economics
- Monetary & Fiscal Tools
- Who's who
- Emblem & Logos
- Currency and Capitals
- Personalities

## **MAT Marking Scheme 2026**

As per the MAT 2026 marking scheme each correct answer is awarded 1 mark, while 0.25 marks are deducted for every incorrect answer. All sections carry equal weightage, with a total of 150 questions and a maximum possible score of 150 marks.

- Key points about the MAT 2025 marking scheme:
- Equal weightage: Each section of the MAT exam has equal weightage.
- Marking per question: 1 mark is awarded for each correct answer.
- Negative marking: 0.25 marks are deducted for each incorrect answer.

No marks for unanswered questions: No marks are deducted for unanswered questions.

## **MAT Vs CAT Exam Pattern: Comparison with other MBA Entrance Exams**

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MAT pattern is not much different than the other national level MBA entrance exams. However, the difficulty levels of questions in CAT and XAT exams is much higher than MAT. Below is shared quick comparison of MAT pattern with other National level exams:

MAT pattern and IIMs CAT exam have many similarities which give the opportunity to the candidates to synchronise their sectional and overall exam preparation. A quick analysis between MAT pattern and CAT will bring home the facts:
