### Official NTA Calculation Process, Example, Expected and Past Data

#### CMAT Score to Percentile: Calculation Process Overview

The transformation from your response sheet to your final NTA Score is a rigorous multi-stage procedure. It is designed to remove the luck factor regarding which shift a candidate is assigned to. In the official CMAT 2026 exam information bulletin, National Test Agency says, "Normalization procedure based on Percentile Score will be used for ensuring that

candidates are neither benefitted nor disadvantaged due to the difficulty level of the examination. With the objective of ensuring that a candidate's true merit is identified, and that a level playing field is created in the above context, the Normalization Procedure, set out below shall be adopted, for compiling the NTA scores for multi session papers."

**Following section explains the CMAT Score and Percentile calculation process in simple and easy terms for candidate's benefit.**

- **First, raw scoring occurs**, where your individual responses are evaluated against the official answer key to determine your initial marks.
- **Second, session-wise sorting takes place**, where you are ranked exclusively against the peers who sat in your exam shift and took the exact same paper as you.
- **Third, percentile mapping for each shift converts this rank into a percentile score**, which is a value between 0 and 100, calculated to seven decimal places to ensure precision.
- **Finally, the master percentile sheet merge combines percentiles from different shifts into one unified All India Merit List**, creating the final NTA CMAT Score. Read more details for each step in the following sections.

#### **How is CMAT Score Calculated? Explained in simple terms**

How To calculate CMAT Marks? The raw CMAT score for each student who appeared in the exam is the primary data point. It represents your absolute performance before any statistical adjustments are made. [CMAT marking scheme](#) of 4 marks awarded to each correct answer and 1 mark deducted for each wrong answer is applied. For example, if a candidate attempts 80 questions and gets 70 right and 10 wrong, their raw score is calculated by multiplying 70 by 4 to get 280, and then subtracting the 10 wrong answers, resulting in 270. Questions left un-attempted are given zero marks. This raw total serves as the input for the CMAT 2026 normalization process.

#### **How is CMAT Percentile Calculated? Explained in simple terms**

How To calculate CMAT Percentile? A percentile is a measure of relative standing in a group. It tells you what percentage of the candidate pool you outperformed within your specific exam session. The statistical formula involves taking the number of candidates in your shift with a raw score equal to or less than yours, dividing it by the total number of candidates who appeared in your shift, and multiplying by 100. Check formula given in the CMAT 2026 Information Bulletin given below.

$$\text{Total Percentile (TP1):} \quad \times \quad 100 \quad \frac{\text{No. of candidates appeared from the session with raw score EQUAL TO OR LESS than T1 score}}{\text{Total No. of candidates appeared in the session}}$$

**Example: If 10,000 students appeared in Shift 1 and you performed better than 9,900 of them, you are in the top 1%, resulting in a 99 percentile ( $100/10000 \times 100$ ).** Hence, the highest scorer in every session of CMAT exam is automatically granted a 100.0000000 percentile. This recognizes the best of each exam session as equal, even if their raw marks vary due to CMAT exam paper difficulty level.

### **Converting Session-wise Percentile Score to All India Merit List**

After percentile scores for each session are calculated based on the above process, the final master percentile sheet is created by merging combines percentiles from different shifts into one unified All India Merit List, creating the final NTA CMAT Score.

### **CMAT Score to Percentile: Example of Candidates in 2 slots**

CMAT exam normalization process protects students in a hard session versus an easy session. In Slot 1, if the paper was so difficult that the top student only managed a raw score of 290 out of 400, that student still receives a 100 percentile. In Slot 2, where the paper was much simpler, the top student might score 350 out of 400, and he/she will also receive a 100 percentile. If you were in the difficult Slot 1 and scored 280, your percentile might be 99.8. However, a student in the easier Slot 2 with the same 280 marks might only be at the 90th percentile because many more students in that shift scored higher than 280. This ensures that the student who faced the harder paper is not penalized. This is how CMAT normalization 2026 process helps students.

### **Key Terms Used in CMAT Score and Percentile**

Here are key terms that are used for understanding CMAT Score Vs Percentile 2026 process.

- **Raw Score** refers to the initial marks calculated from correct and incorrect answers.
- **NTA Score** is the final, normalized percentile that appears on your result card and is the only score B-schools use for shortlisting. Seven-decimal precision is used to prevent hundreds of students from being tied at the same rank by extending the calculation to seven decimal places, such as 99.8765432.

### **Implications for CMAT 2026 Test Takers**

Understanding CMAT 2026 Score vs Percentile Calculation process is very helpful for candidates taking the exam. After understanding this process, you should NOT target a particular score because exam paper difficulty is unknown. Aiming for a specific number like 300 can be dangerous if a 280 is enough for a 99th percentile on a hard paper. **Accuracy in CMAT exam is more important than number of attempts because negative marks are devastating under the seven-decimal CMAT percentile calculation formula.** It does not just drop your score; it can push you behind hundreds of other people in the fine-tuned ranking. Finally, understanding CMAT Score Vs Percentile calculation process helps you get into correct test-taking mindset. If you find the paper very hard, do not panic. A tough paper

means the normalization will work in your favor as long as you outperform the others in your specific shift.
