GENESIS OF DSGS FORMATION

Consequent to the AICTE Directive, the Institute Strategic Committee decided to establish a new Institute solely for the purpose of PGDM Curriculum. The newly created Institute was named as Durgadevi Saraf Global Business School (DSGS). Dr. Sarita Vichore has been bestowed with the responsibility of heading DSGS.

The Vision, Mission, Values and Beliefs of DSGS are in parity to DSIMS, with a greater focus on International Collaboration. In the Governing Council Meeting held on 28 November, 2020, the formation of the DSGS to cater PGDM program has been approved by the Governing Council members.

Excerpts from the AICTE Approval Process Handbook 2020-2021:

Section 2.18, Page No.55-

Conversion of PGDM Course(s) into MBA Course(s) and vice-versa: Institutions offering both PGDM and MBA Courses could not be considered as Standalone Institutions, as some of the Courses are being offered with the University affiliation.....

The Council shall not permit the conduct of PGDM and MBA Courses in the same Institution, instead the Institutions are permitted to run all the Courses as either PGDM or MBA completely. Further the Trust/ Society/ Company intending to run both the Courses shall apply for a new Technical Institution to offer PGDM Course under Chapter I of the Approval Process Handbook.

ADMISSION CRITERIA: ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Basic Qualification:

- The candidate should be an Indian National.
- Passed minimum three years duration Bachelor's Degree awarded by any of the Universities recognized by University Grants Commission or Association of Indian Universities in any discipline with at least 50% marks in aggregate or Equivalent (at least 45% in case of candidates of backward class categories, Economically weaker section and Persons with Disability Candidates belonging to Maharashtra state only) or its equivalent;
- Obtained non-zero score at any one of the following entrance examinations required for admission in the concerned Academic Year; MH-CET, CAT, ATMA, GMAT, MAT, CMAT, CET, XAT. Any other (as per the AICTE norms for minority colleges).

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- The Application Form for PGDM is available online on the institute's website: www.DSGS.org.in
- The student needs to fill & submit the form online and pay application form fees of Rs. 2,000 through online payment mode.
- Submit a printout of the downloaded PDF application form along with the Entrance Score Card and Graduation Mark sheet, (if appearing, submit last semester mark sheet) within two days from the date of submission of online form.
- Only on receipt of the form and application fees, one would be considered for GD/PI.
- Submission of online admission form does not guarantee an admission to the PGDM Programme.

CURRICULUM

We Do Differently @

DSGS

The world has changed over a period of time and along with this the needs of the industry and the expectations about managers have also undergone a sea change. But management education has not progressed much beyond where it all began. The result is that the Industry believes “management graduates are not employable from day one”. The industry demands management graduates who can be productive from day one, who have a global outlook but a local mindset and whose education is relevant for these turbulent times.

To meet the requirement of the Industry and to keep the sanctity of the class room learning, the PGDM Program has developed a series of unique interventions - a unique, blended pedagogy which aims to produce a day one, job ready managers. We would classify our innovations into two broad categories:

1. Innovations in class room pedagogy
2. Innovations beyond class room initiatives

Special Engagement Program (SEP)

The Special Engagement Program (SEP) is an intervention and certification course designed to get students from different disciplines ready for



fundamental requisites of business studies. It aims at bringing students to one platform by eliminating gaps within various domains. This intervention makes the learning more seamless and smooth for two years of PGDM program.

The sessions under SEP cover topics like Managerial (organizational) Communication, Value Quest, Case study based learning, Fundamentals of Management, Stress Management, Basics of Accounting, Personal Growth Lab, Emotional Intelligence, Basics of Excel, Power Point Presentation, Book Review, Basics of Business, Introduction to R programming, Non Violent communication (NVC), EYE (Elevate Your Elegance).

Leader In Making

In this era of constant change and globalization, aspirants have to face multiple challenges in the professional arena. The focus on academics alone does not suffice in making a transition from campus to the corporate world. Keeping this need in mind 'Leader In Making' aims to prepare students by equipping them with skills to make them placement ready.

Objectives:

1. To impart skills to students in certain areas that will help them in their academics.
2. To improve communication skills of the students.
3. To impart skills that will help the students in getting placed.

The objectives will be achieved by administering training modules in the following areas

1. Resume Writing
2. Interview Skills
3. Oral and Written Communication
4. Basic and Advanced MS Excel
5. Aptitude Tests

Parents Connect

"Parents Connect" is an initiative designed to build stronger connections between an educational institution and the parents of its students. It provides parents with an opportunity to understand the institution's vision, values, and programs, while also engaging with faculty and staff. The initiative often includes discussions on student development, well-being, and guidance on supporting academic and personal growth. It encourages interaction, networking, and a sense of



community, helping parents stay informed and involved in their postgraduate child's educational journey.

Well-Being initiatives

Students shared overwhelmingly positive feedback, highlighting how her guidance gave them actionable strategies to handle academic pressures and personal stress effectively.

Her ability to transform complex ideas into simple, actionable solutions left a lasting impression, contributing significantly to the emotional resilience and overall well-being of the students.

The session was engaging, informative, and interactive, comprising various activities that equipped students with practical strategies to identify and manage stressors. The students benefited immensely, taking away valuable insights and suggestions.

ESG Workshop

ESG grew out of investment philosophies clustered around sustainability and, thereafter, socially responsible investing. Early efforts focused on “screening out” (that is, excluding) companies from portfolios largely due to environmental, social or governance concerns, while more recently ESG has favorably distinguished companies that are making positive contributions to the elements of ESG, premised on treating environmental and social issues as core elements of strategic positioning. While climate figures prominently in ESG discussions, there is no single list of ESG goals or examples, and ESG concepts often overlap. That being said, the three categories of ESG are increasingly integrated into investment analysis, processes and decision-making.

- The “E” captures energy efficiencies, carbon footprints, greenhouse gas emissions, deforestation, biodiversity, climate change and pollution mitigation, waste management and water usage.

- The “S” covers labor standards, wages and benefits, workplace and board diversity, racial justice, pay equity, human rights, talent management, community relations, privacy and data protection, health and safety, supply-chain management and other human capital and social justice issues.

- The “G” covers the governing of the “E” and the “S” categories—corporate board composition and structure, strategic sustainability oversight and compliance, executive compensation, political contributions and lobbying, and bribery and corruption.

Job opportunities related to ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance) are growing exponentially, and the DSGS Placement Cell has also observed a significant rise in such job descriptions. In response, we have decided to introduce an ESG workshop. The workshop combines both theoretical knowledge and practical application, enabling students to gain valuable hands-on experience in this emerging field.



Power BI workshop

Entering corporate life as a young professional can be exhilarating and challenging. In this data-driven era, interpreting, visualizing, and presenting data is a crucial skill. This is where Power BI, a powerful business analytics tool by Microsoft, comes into play. Understanding and mastering Power BI can be a game-changer, empowering you to make data-driven decisions, create compelling visualizations, and effectively communicate insights.

Realizing that embracing Power BI can significantly enhance students' analytical capabilities and provide them with an edge in today's competitive corporate landscape DSGS introduced a Power BI workshop for their students.

Experiential learning

At DSGS, we believe in empowering postgraduate

students through Experiential Learning, a hands-on approach that goes beyond traditional classroom instruction. Our comprehensive program incorporates diverse methods, including case studies, field visits, role-plays, demonstrations, and learning by doing. Students also gain proficiency in the R programming language, enhancing their data analysis skills. Additionally, we organize visits to industry sites, providing real-world exposure. To foster team building and leadership skills, we are introducing outbound training, where students will participate in immersive, activity-based learning. This holistic approach enables our students to apply theoretical concepts to practical scenarios, preparing them for successful careers.

Innovative Pedagogy

We have nurtured one of the best learning environments at DSGS. The learning process at DSGS begins before the students enter the learning rooms and continues far beyond the institute. The rigorous yet flexible process focuses on combining clarity on the core concepts with the constraints of execution in a dynamic, globalized environment. The learning process includes experiential learning, workshops, case analysis, role plays, presentations, debates and discussions. The effort is supplemented by our “Corporate to Campus” effort where select Industry leaders are invited to interact with the students. As a student of DSGS, you will get a chance to interact with some of the best minds of the Indian Industry.



Mahakumbh Mela 3D Model Presentation

The Mahakumbh Mela 3D Model Project, conducted on 15th February 2025, was an experiential learning initiative under the Project Management subject for PGDM (A & B) Batch 2024–26 students, guided by Prof. Kitty Rana. The project applied project management principles to simulate the planning and execution of the Maha

Kumbh Mela 2025 in Prayagraj—one of the world’s largest gatherings. Students worked in teams to create a detailed 3D model depicting logistics, crowd management, transportation, sanitation, security, medical aid, and risk mitigation strategies. The initiative effectively integrated classroom learning with real-world application, emphasizing resource planning, stakeholder management, and contingency preparedness.

Business News Analysis (BNA)

To improve the reading and analytic skills of students and help them remain contemporary and relevant, DSGS conducts “Business News Analysis” sessions are conducted where they follow the significant news and developments on sectors of their choice and share their readings and understanding with their peers. The sessions are moderated by faculty members who further add to the perspective.

Business Immersion

Business Immersion makes students examine, analyze and evaluate complex process that challenges managers along the business cycle. The program begins with the students doing a thorough, structured analysis of the major sectors of the Economy. Periodically, the students will present their understanding of the sectors to a panel of faculty and Industry leaders from the concerned sectors. The panel will guide the students and ensure that the learnings are maximized.

After the industry analysis, the students deep dive into the sector of their choice. In this process, the students get familiar with the regulatory guidelines, current industry best practices and emerging next practices. This is be done through both industry visits as well as interaction with a wide range of experts. On completion of this exercise, the students identify their role within the sector and study the pre requisites of excelling in the role. This includes close interaction with a few role models from the sector. The students learn the processes and rules that govern the operations of the chosen role, the skills and knowledge needed to excel.

Analytical and Critical Thinking - ACT

We have developed the ACT to help our students develop their ability to weigh alternatives, make decisions and evaluate seemingly contradictory facts. ACT is anchored in the necessity to inculcate the art of critically analyzing any issue and developing cogent and powerful arguments for and

against any broad, multi disciplinary issues that face the nation, the society or the corporate.

This exercise aims to develop the following in our students:

- Analytical writing skills
- Strategic planning and data acquisition
- Creative thinking
- Asking the right questions
- Logical reasoning

Broad based reading

The distinctive feature of our curriculum is the wider reading that the students have to do to prepare for the class – including the use of news paper, magazine articles, thought leadership pieces from journals and blogs in the class room to drive learning.

Thought Leadership Forum (TLF)

Great leaders are not born, but made. In keeping with this adage, students read, listen to and interact with leaders from the corporate world, who are invited to the campus to share their experiences of practicing leadership and achieving excellence in diverse domains.

Meet the Celebrity

This intervention aims at bringing accomplished writers and known personalities to the campus. Students get an opportunity to interact with these high achievers and learn during this process.



Entrepreneurship Development Cell (E-Cell)

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell of the institute was set up in 2020. To promote entrepreneurship among the DSGS students and create an environment conducive for entrepreneurial activities. The students get exposure to various professional courses like Student Entrepreneurship Development programme wherein professional experts help the students to make business plan and carry their ideas forward in the market. Because of such initiatives students become more confident in expressing their ideas and learn the talent of thinking out of the box.

Networking for Young Adults

A guest session was held on 21st August 2025 for the first year PGDM students on 'Networking for Young Adults', by Dr. Ajinkya Raut, a Dentist turned Entrepreneur and Business Coach and Area Director with BNI (Business Network International). He is the author of "Awkward to Awesome – A Young Adult's Guide to Networking".

He emphasized that networking is not about collecting contacts but about building meaningful relationships. He highlighted that curiosity, clarity and consistency are the keys to effective networking. Using frameworks like FORD, the 3C model and the 24/7/30 method, he explained how to initiate, sustain and grow connections. He stressed the importance of personal branding and giving value before seeking anything in return. The session encouraged students to focus on depth over quantity, nurture relationships regularly and remember that someone is always waiting for their contribution.

Bringing Industry to classroom

We ensure to organize guests sessions in each subject under the academic curriculum of PGDM.

These guest sessions are conducted by seasoned industry practitioners and are embedded into the regular lecture schedule. These sessions help the students relate the classroom learning to industry applications.

Case Study Centre

Case based teaching is an important tool for the teaching pedagogy. The institute has developed a congenial eco-system that encourages professors to continuously prepare own cases for academic discussions. Apart from arm chair cases, the professors have written many live cases. Thanks to the institutes deep industry connect, faculty members have established very good network with Mumbai based companies and write cases after conducting interviews with senior executives and other stakeholders.

Business cases of several Indian industries have been written on variety of fields – marketing, finance, human relations and entrepreneurship management by in-house faculty. CEOs and other senior mentors have been invited to come to class rooms and interact with students to share their experiences.

Leadership Development Centre

The institute has established leadership Development Centre to nurture leadership capabilities of all stakeholders. The strong faculty team of the institute that undertakes researches on leadership Development.

Under Leadership Development Centre, the institute takes up many Faculty Development Programs to hone their mentees' leadership capabilities. The institute further conducts many leadership development programs for young students in and around Mumbai.

The centre has intensively studied notable Indian business and social leaders. The centre further researched of many leading Harvard Professors' contributions on leadership development. Based on the finding the Leadership Development Centre has developed interesting modules for numerous seminars, workshops, faculty development programs and management development programs.

Building and Strengthening International Connect

Industry-Institute Partnership Cell (IIPC)

The students are exposed to practices of professional managers through numerous guest lectures. The guest speakers are carefully chosen to represent a wide domain of functions and industries. Apart from bringing the corporate to the campus, the IIPC is active in taking the campus to the corporate.

Our students have visited NSE, Mumbai; Mumbai Port Trust; Bisleri, Santacruz, Mumbai; Mahindra at Kandivali; Raymonds at Vapi, Warehouses in Mumbai and Coke plant in Varanasi, Rashtriya Chemicals & Fertilizers (RCF) in Mumbai and Godfrey Phillips India Ltd. in Mumbai.



Field Trip to CEAT Tyres

A field trip was organised by Prof. Somesh Banerji to CEAT Ltd. Bhandup (RPG Group) for the PGDM students on 3rd September 2025 with an objective to provide valuable insights into world-class manufacturing practices, organizational culture and the integration of quality, safety and sustainability in business operations. The key learning outcomes of the field visit were exposure to the large scale industrial operations and lean manufacturing concepts, understanding of employee empowerment and participative management. The students gained practical knowledge of TQM, PDCA/ SDCA and quality improvement mechanisms along with insights into CEAT's sustainability, CSR and people first culture. The visit successfully bridged classroom concepts of Operations and Quality Management with real world industrial applications.

Student Exchange Programs

The PGDM program in its quest to strengthen global connect, have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in 2017 with the various prestigious universities to facilitate our PGDM students to study credit courses.

Since 2017, PGDM students have visited international universities to study courses like-Servant leadership and Business Ethics. The faculties have also visited international universities to address students and to interact with their prestigious faculty and members of the management.

Our students have visited to OU campus and OU students with one of their distinguished Economics Professor and few Trustees visited the campus in for an academic cum cultural exchange program at DSGS campus. These OU students attended 15 classroom sessions in the area of Finance, Marketing, Human Resources, Operations, Indian Economy, Indian Culture and Ethos. The OU



students were highly satisfied with the exposure gained through the visit which they have reflected through their formal feedback.

A notable case shared was the transformation of traditional tamarind into pocket-friendly imli candies, demonstrating how innovation in packaging and positioning can create entirely new markets.



REMSONS Centre for Management Research

DSGS organized the 11th Remsons International Research Conference 2025 on 02 August, 2025, under the aegis of Remsons Centre for Management Research (RCMR). The theme of the Conference was "Building Atmanirbhar Bharat: Strategies for Sustainable Development".

A guest session on 'Insights on the future of Web3,

He explained that Blockchain is a digital record book that has information which is transparent yet secured. 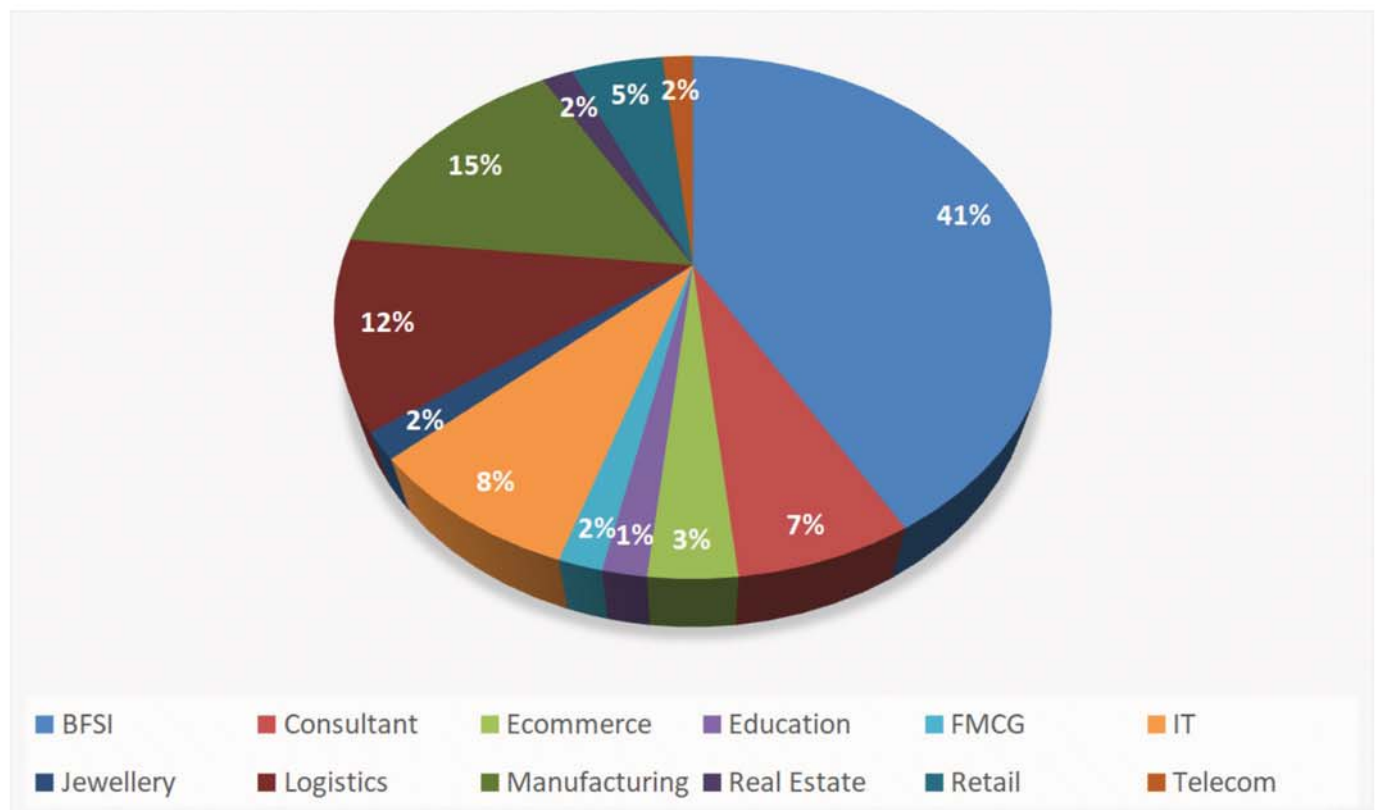
