Exam Pattern, Difficulty Level, Previous Year Papers Comparison

MAH MBA CET Slot 1 Analysis: MAH MBA CET slot 1 exam was held on April 6 from 9.00 AM to 11.30 AM. The MAH MBA CET 2026 Day 1 Slot 1 was rated as easy to moderate difficulty level paper by the students. Paper was not conceptually difficult, but it was lengthy, particularly in Logical Reasoning and Quantitative Aptitude. There was no change in exam patten with 200 questions to be attempted in 150 minutes and no negative marking. Based on student feedback and expert analysis, this slot is expected to witness a higher cutoff compared to last year. - Slot 1 of MAH MBA CET 2026 was a speed-driven paper with low conceptual difficulty but high time pressure.

MAH MBA CET 2026 Analysis: Day 1 Slot 1 Section-wise Highlights

Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension (VARC):

The VARC section was easy to moderate, with a clear tilt towards vocabulary and grammar-based questions. There were 5 Reading Comprehension passages contributing 20 questions. The passages were of moderate length and covered a mix of contemporary and general topics:

- Women Empowerment
- Cybercrime
- Tariffs
- Electric Vehicles (EVs)
- One additional general topic passage

Most RC questions were direct and detail-based, although a few required inference. Some students reported that at least one RC was difficult to attempt within time.

The remaining 30 questions were from Verbal Ability, making this a scoring section for students with strong basics.

The grammar questions included error spotting, active-passive voice, direct-indirect speech, sentence correction, and sentence completion.

Overall, students found this section manageable and scoring, with high accuracy possible in VA.

Quantitative Aptitude:

The Quant section was easy to moderate, but calculation-intensive, making it time-consuming.

A significant number of questions involved decimals and multi-step calculations, which slowed down attempts despite the underlying concepts being straightforward.

The section was dominated by Arithmetic, with minimal presence of Algebra.

Many students reported around 30–35 genuine attempts, indicating that while the section was doable, time management played a key role.

Logical Reasoning:

Logical Reasoning was easy in terms of difficulty, but structurally very different from typical CET papers.

The most notable deviation was the absence of traditional puzzles, with nearly all questions being standalone.

Only one puzzle-type set was reported. Several questions belonged to Quant-type reasoning, including Time-Speed-Distance, Probability, and Divisibility.

Many questions were direct, with options that could be eliminated quickly. However, the section was lengthy and required strong time management.

Abstract Reasoning:

Abstract Reasoning was easy and highly scoring, although a few questions were slightly ambiguous.

The section was dominated by figure-based and visual reasoning questions.

MAH MBA CET 2026 Exam Analysis: Slot 2

MAH MBA CET Slot 2 Analysis: MAH MBA CET slot 2 exam was held on April 6 from 2.00 PM to 4.30 PM. Slot 2 of MAH MBA CET 2026 exam paper was very similar to Slot 1, contrary to the usual trend where Slot 2 tends to be more difficult. Overall difficulty level of Day 1 Slot 2 was easy to moderate, like slot 1. Based on multiple student interactions and initial feedback, this slot was arguably one of the easiest in recent years, with most sections being straightforward but slightly lengthy due to the number of questions and calculations involved. The paper continued to follow the [MAH MBA CET pattern](#) of 200 questions in 150 minutes with no negative marking.

Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension (VARC):

The VARC section was easy to moderate and largely scoring.

There were 4 Reading Comprehension passages contributing 20 questions. The passages were based on:

- Mahatma Gandhi
- Online Banking
- Metals and Paper Money
- Higher Education

The RCs were mostly direct. One passage, particularly on Mahatma Gandhi, was slightly difficult, while the others were straightforward. The Verbal Ability section focused on vocabulary, grammar, and sentence-based questions.

MAH MBA CET 2026 Exam Analysis: Slot 3

MAH MBA CET Slot 3 Analysis: MAH MBA CET slot 3 exam was held on April 7 from 9.00 AM to 11.30 AM. Slot 3 of MAH MBA CET 2026 continued the pattern set by earlier slots, offering a paper that was broadly easy to moderate in difficulty but demanding in terms of time management. Logical Reasoning was the defining section of this slot not due to high difficulty, but because of the sheer length of individual questions. Some singlets were verbose & once again there were no traditionally asked puzzles of 5 questions each, slowing down even well prepared students. Abstract Reasoning, by contrast, was one of the most scoring sections of the day, with the majority of questions being straightforward and several drawn directly from previous years' papers. Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension (VARC)

VARC in Slot 3 was easy to moderate. The section featured 4 Reading Comprehension

passages. Three of the four passages were rated easy to moderate, with direct and inference based questions. One passage was difficult and time consuming. The remaining questions in VARC covered vocabulary and grammar, both rated easy to moderate respectively.

Quantitative Aptitude & Data Interpretation

The Quant section in Slot 3 was rated easy to moderate, with a structure broadly similar to other slots. The section had two Data Interpretation sets of 5 marks each, consistent with previous slots. 1 set was easy to moderate & other was moderate to difficult, and students who attempted them with care reported good accuracy. The remaining questions were spread across standard arithmetic topics Time, Speed and Distance, Time and Work, Profit and Loss, Mixture & Allegations and other related topics. Students who prioritised the arithmetic questions and used the DI sets strategically were able to achieve good attempt counts.

Logical Reasoning

Logical Reasoning was the most time-intensive section of Slot 3 and the key differentiator between high scorers and average scorers. While the section was not difficult in terms of concepts, the questions were lengthy and verbose, with singlets that required significantly more reading time than in past years. Of the 75 questions, approximately 50 were standalone singlets individually solvable, but each demanded careful reading. Critical Reasoning accounted for around 10 questions, ranging from easy to moderate. The section also had 3

puzzle type questions worth 2 marks each, a relatively lower puzzle presence compared to previous year papers.

Abstract Reasoning

Abstract Reasoning was the highlight of Slot 3 in terms of ease and scoring potential. The section was rated very easy by the majority of students, with most questions being immediately solvable. Series-based questions including odd one out, missing figure, and next-in-series formed a significant portion of the section, with 3 - 4 questions reported to be direct PYQs.

Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension (VARC):

The RCs were relatively straightforward and could often be answered through skimming rather than detailed reading. The Verbal Ability section had a strong focus on vocabulary and grammar.

Slot 5 of MAH MBA CET 2026 marked a slight shift from the earlier slots, with the paper being rated **moderate overall**. While some sections remained straightforward, others, particularly Logical Reasoning, demanded **more time and careful reading**. Unlike Slot 1, 2, and 4, this slot introduced a **slightly higher level of variation in question types**. Logical Reasoning

Logical Reasoning was the **most challenging section in this slot**, primarily due to its length and variety. Unlike earlier slots, this section included:

- Quantitative Aptitude: 40–50 minutes

Students should remain flexible and adjust based on paper difficulty, but the overall goal should be to **ensure coverage of all sections without getting stuck.**
