CAT Exam Pattern 2026

CAT Exam pattern is divided in three sections: Verbal Ability & Reading Comprehension, Data Interpretation & Logical Reasoning, and Quantitative Ability. Each section can be further divided into sub-sections. Over the last five years, the CAT exam pattern has undergone several notable changes in its pattern, number of questions, and difficulty level. CAT exam pattern has become more focused on conceptual clarity, time management, and reasoning ability. The expected CAT 2026 Exam pattern is given below. CAT 2026 Verbal Ability Syllabus

Verbal Ability (VA) is a key part of the Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension (VARC) section in the CAT exam. VA tests a candidate's command over the English language, logical reasoning in language-based questions, and ability to analyze written information.

Verbal Ability section includes topics such as Para Jumbles, Para Summary, and Odd One Out, which test a candidate's ability to structure information logically. CAT Verbal Ability section also has non-MCQ or TITA questions – read details below. CAT Verbal Ability questions constitute about 30-35% share in Verbal Ability and Reading Comprehension (VARC) Section in the CAT exam.

Based on previous year's papers, CAT VARC Syllabus 2026 and type of questions is given below.

CAT Verbal Ability Syllabus 2026

Topic Area	Description
Paragraph Completion	Paragraph Completion questions present a paragraph with its final sentence missing. Candidates must choose the most logical and contextually appropriate concluding sentence from the given options. This question type tests your ability to understand the central idea, tone, and flow of a passage.
Para Jumble	Candidates are given four to five jumbled sentences that must be arranged in the correct logical order to form a coherent paragraph. These questions test logical flow, coherence, and an understanding of transition words.
Para Summary	A short paragraph is provided, and candidates must choose the most accurate summary from the given options. This tests comprehension, the ability to differentiate between main ideas and supporting details, and logical reasoning.
Odd One Out	A set of four to five sentences is given, and candidates must identify the one that does not fit into the sequence. This assesses the ability to identify logical continuity and coherence in writing.

CAT 2026 Reading Comprehension Syllabus

Reading Comprehension (RC) is a very important part of the VARC section in the CAT exam. RC section involves reading passages from different subject areas such as literature, business, science, philosophy, and social sciences, and answering a set of questions that test candidate's understanding. While there is no fixed syllabus for RC in CAT, according to previous year CAT exam analysis, we can understand topics which often appear in RC section. Some of the topics are given in the table below.

Psychology	CAT Reading Comprehension passages on Psychology explore how the human mind works. It covers cognitive processes, decision-making biases, memory, perception, and behavioural theories proposed by thinkers like Freud, Piaget, and Kahneman. These passages demand careful reading as they often blend scientific reasoning with abstract concepts, making inference-based questions particularly challenging.
Philosophy	CAT Reading Comprehension passages on Philosophy examine fundamental questions about knowledge, ethics, reality, and human existence. These passages draw from both Western and Eastern philosophical traditions. These passages are often abstract and argument-driven, requiring candidates to closely follow the author's line of reasoning to answer tone, inference, and logical structure-based questions accurately.
History	CAT RC passages on History are typically drawn from Indian, British, and American historical events, exploring themes of colonialism, social reform, and political change. These passages are generally fact-dense, requiring candidates to distinguish between stated facts and the author's interpretation.
Arts and Museum	CAT RC passages on Arts and Museum cover painting, sculpture, architecture, and curatorial practice. They often analyse how art reflects the cultural and historical context of its time. Candidates must pay close attention to the author's perspective and evaluative tone, as questions frequently test interpretation rather than factual recall.
Society	CAT RC passages on Society examine issues such as gender, inequality, social mobility, and community identity. These passages often present multiple viewpoints on complex social challenges. These passages tend to be opinion-driven, making it essential to identify the author's stance and distinguish it from views being critiqued.
Culture	CAT RC passages on Culture explore language, traditions, customs, and the interplay between different civilisations and communities. These passages are often descriptive yet nuanced, requiring candidates to grasp subtle distinctions in meaning and avoid over-generalising the author's observations.

CAT Syllabus 2026 for Data Interpretation Section

Data Interpretation for CAT section tests a candidate's ability to analyze, interpret, and draw conclusions from a given numerical data. The questions in CAT Data Interpretation section are typically based on tables, bar graphs, line charts, pie charts, caselets, and mixed data sets. Syllogisms	Involves logical deductions based on given statements using concepts like "All," "Some," and "None."
Coding-Decoding	Questions where words, letters, or numbers follow a pattern or code that must be identified to decode information.
Direction Sense	Requires understanding movement-based clues to determine direction and final positions.
Puzzles	Logical sets involving constraints and conditions that require systematic analysis to arrive at a solution.
Venn Diagrams & Set Theory	Questions involving overlapping sets, intersections, and unions, requiring logical grouping of data.
Input-Output	Questions based on a sequence of operations applied to an input, requiring identification of the underlying logical pattern.
Clocks & Calendars	Questions related to time calculations, angles in clocks, and calendar-based date problems.
Logical Sequences	Requires identifying the missing element in a given pattern or sequence based on logical rules.
Data Sufficiency (Logical Reasoning)	Tests whether given statements provide enough information to answer a logical reasoning question.

Quantitative Aptitude (QA) for CAT section assesses a candidate's mathematical skills, problem-solving ability, and numerical aptitude. The questions in Quantitative Aptitude test the conceptual clarity, logical application, and time management skills. 6. **Learn to eliminate Incorrect Options Systematically:** Many incorrect answers contain extreme words like "always," "never," "must," or "completely." Some options may be factually correct but not relevant to the question.

- Take 2-3 full-length mocks per week, simulating actual test conditions.
- Revise all important formulas, shortcuts, and strategies.
- Develop a final exam strategy (which section to attempt first, how to manage time).

Last Week: Light Revision & Mental Preparation

- Revise all important formulas, shortcuts, and strategies.
- Solve previous CAT papers for last-minute revision.
- Avoid unnecessary stress—don't try to learn anything new.
- Maintain a consistent sleep cycle for exam day readiness.
- Stay confident and positive—trust your preparation.
